## Extension Activity

### >> Roll, Circle, and Say

- Materials:

- ① **Activity Sheet 10** - Photocopiable from page 131  
(Also printable from Teacher Resource CD)
- ② a die and two counters (per pair)

- How to play:

- ① Give each student a copy of Activity Sheet 10.
- ② Pair up students and give each pair a die and two counters.
- ③ Students take turns rolling the die and moving their counters on their own game board. When an odd number is rolled, they can move their counter one space. When an even number is rolled, they can move two spaces.
- ④ Students read the comparative in the square, circle the matching picture, and say the comparative sentence. For example, *The tree is taller than the giraffe.*
- ⑤ Play until one of the students reaches FINISH. The student who circles more pictures wins the game.

### Possible Answers

- 1 The tree is taller than the giraffe. The giraffe is shorter than the tree.
- 2 The elephant is bigger than the lion. The lion is smaller than the elephant.
- 3 The plane is faster than the train. The train is slower than the plane.
- 4 Turtles are faster than snails. Snails are slower than turtles.
- 5 The computer is cheaper than the bike. The bike is more expensive than the computer.
- 6 She thinks the book is more interesting than the movie.
- 7 Egypt is hotter than Korea. Korea is colder than Egypt.
- 8 He thinks English is easier than math. He thinks math is more difficult than English.
