













► Cut out the picture cards. Match, say, and take the cards.

Extension Activity

>> Match and Take

- Materials:

- ① **Activity Sheet 8** - Photocopiable from page 129
(Also printable from Teacher Resource CD)
- ② a pouch/bag and scissors (per pair)

- How to play:

- ① Pair up students and give each pair a copy of Activity Sheet 8, a pouch, and scissors.
- ② Students cut out the picture cards and put them in the pouch. Take one card out of the pouch, and put it face up on the table.
- ③ In pairs, students take turns drawing a card from the pouch. When there is a matching card on the table, they can take both cards and say the sentences. For example, *There are some bananas. There aren't any bananas.* Otherwise, they put the card face up on the table.
- ④ The student with more cards wins the game.

- 2 There aren't any bananas.
- 3 There is some cheese.
- 4 There isn't any cheese.
- 5 There is some juice.
- 6 There isn't any juice.
- 7 There are some cookies.
- 8 There aren't any cookies.

- 12 There isn't any ice cream.
- 13 There are some flowers.
- 14 There aren't any flowers.
